Forsyth Tech Aviation Lab to hold ribbon cutting

Forsyth Technical Community College's new aviation lab at Smith Reynolds Airport will hold its ribbon cutting ceremony in October. In order to limit the crowd size due to COVID-19, the event will be invitation only. It will be streamed on Forsyth Tech's YouTube at 11 a.m. on Oct. 26.

Located at 2739 Aviation Drive, the Mazie S. Woodruff Aviation Technology Lab is a two-story, 51,962 square foot building. It has a 15,356 square foot aviation hangar that can

house up to eight aircraft. It also has classrooms and components labs that include sheet metal, composite structures like fiberglass and carbon fiber, avionics/electrical, paint, aircraft welding and piston/turbine engines.

Students will be able to earn associate degrees in two programs of study: Aviation Systems Technol-

ogy and Aviation Electronics (Avionics). This will prepare students for jobs in Maintenance Overhaul and Repair (MRO) needed by aerospace companies at Smith Reynolds Airport and around the state and country. The Aviation Lab has relationships with local, state and national employers who are in constant need of aircraft maintenance and avionics technicians.

Classes are projected to begin this spring. The lab has partnered with Carver High School and other high schools to encourage students to enroll in the program and develop opportunities for them to learn there.

It also hosted the Jim Shaw ACE Academy over the summer. The aviation summer camp exposes middle and high school student to potential careers in the aviation industry. The camp is held annually at Smith Reynolds

> Airport and was started by the late Jim Shaw, who served on the Airport Board.

The Aviation Lab is a \$16 million project funded by a \$65 million Forsyth Tech bond package voters overwhelmingly approved in 2016 after county commissioners voted to place it on the ballot.

The lab is named after

the late Mazie Woodruff, who became the first African-American elected as a Forsyth County commissioner in 1976. Forsyth Tech's Mazie Woodruff Center, located on Lansing Drive, is also named in her honor.

Garner Foods breaks ground Lansing Drive facility



Garner Foods broke ground on its new facility beside the airport at 4897 Lansing Drive on August 24.

Garner's first project on the site is the construction of a warehouse facility to provide additional space for Garner Foods' products as the company expands to meet growing demand. The property has enough room for both the preliminary facility and future planned expansions. Garner plans to complete the Phase 1 warehouse facility and move into it by May of 2022.


Forsyth County Government sold the approximately 30 acre property to Garner Foods earlier this year. The property was part of the airport's layout plan, but it was not used for

aeronautical purposes and is not part of the airport's long-term development plans. It can support a large, flat facility without interfering with airport operations. In compliance with federal laws and regulations on airport property sales, all sale proceeds went to the airport.

Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools is still using part of the property for staff parking and as a base of operations for school maintenance staff as the County searches for a place to relocate those operations. WS/FC Schools will leaseback a portion of the property for a two-year term once a certificate of occupancy is issued for the warehouse project to allow time for the school system to move its operations.



FAA Conditionally Approves Plan for Taxiway Alpha



As reported in the last two Airport Beacon Report, the FAA has informed the County that they are no longer considering a project that would require the purchase of 16 homes on Teresa Avenue. The FAA District Office in Memphis is only considering construction options for the existing Taxiway, which is on the other side of the runway. On March 16, 2021, the County received a letter from the FAA that conditionally approved the Modification to Standard Request. Preliminary plans

reviewed by the FAA, depicts portions of the Taxiway Alpha relocated approximately 120 feet, while other portions move approximately 30 feet. This is being done to improve safety at the Airport for all users and to minimize any impacts to the community. As mentioned before in many meetings, it is our goal to keep the lines of communication open and to do what we can to keep you informed.
